There are two airports in Mexico City (CDMX).
ALWAYS choose AICM (Aeropuerto Internacional de la Ciudad de Mexico)

Take Didi or Uber to move around in the cities

Tips in Mexico: 10-15%

Holafly for esim/internet (if needed)

Once in Mérida, ubers cannot pick you up from the airport but CAN drop you off.

Book a taxi from the desks inside the airport to get into the city.

The fee is around \$430 MXN for 3 people. (£17 / \$23 USD).

Bring cash so you can tip your driver.
